WELCOME to the world of non-profit GRANTS funding! Whether you are a seasoned grant writer or just learning about the grants process, *The Complete Guide to Florida Foundations* will help you raise your organization's funding levels. The information in this edition was obtained through the analysis of each foundation's Internal Revenue Service Form 990-PF, a public tax record filed annually with the federal government, and, wherever possible, from data provided directly by individual foundations. We have made every attempt to verify the information contained on each IRS Form 990-PF. Any questions regarding the data contained in the profiles should be addressed to an officer or staff member of the respective foundation.

This edition profiles over 3,700 private Florida foundations with assets totaling over \$13.4 billion.

WHAT IS A FOUNDATION?

Strictly speaking, a foundation is a type of trust required to return at least 5% of its assets annually to the nonprofit sector. It does this by making grants to charitable tax-exempt corporations, also known as 501(c)(3) organizations or as public charities. There are four types of private foundations incorporated in the United States:

Independent foundations are private grant-making organizations that are derived from a gift of an individual, family, or group of close associates. The management staff of these foundations can range from a few family members to a large staff hired to influence public policy.

Corporate foundations are also private grant-making organizations, but these are established through the contributions of a profit-making company or corporation. A corporate foundation is a separate entity of a sponsoring corporation, legally distinct from the corporation's corporate giving program.

Community foundations are formed by contributors who want their charitable gifts to remain in a specified service area. Community foundations can contain a general fund as well as donor-specified trusts. These foundations are the easiest to approach.

Operating foundations usually provide operating funds to a specified nonprofit in the form of an endowment or trust. Most operating foundations are grant recipients and are, therefore, not profiled in this book. For the purposes of this publication, a "foundation" is a private grant-making organization, which files IRS Form 990-PF as its annual tax record.

✓ **INSIDE TIP: SEND A QUERY LETTER**

If an independent foundation accepts unsolicited requests for donations, send a letter requesting information on how to become a member of its qualified recipient list. This approach is often more effective than simply requesting a grant.

✓ **INSIDE TIP: DON'T REQUEST MORE THAN THE MAXIMUM**

Community foundations generally give grants ranging between \$5,000 and \$10,000. Once you determine the maximum gift usually granted, don't ask for more!

HELPFUL HINTS

By reading this section you will learn how to use *The Complete Guide to Florida Foundations*. It is important that you take a moment to review the following tips, definitions, and comments.

ADDRESSES AND PHONE NUMBERS

The addresses and phone numbers found in this book were current at the time of printing. This is important to keep in mind because contact data for many foundations frequently change. Also keep in mind that many foundations do not employ a staff but are instead administered by banks, accounting firms, law firms, brokerage or investment firms, or by other professional groups which provide part-time staff. The addresses and phone numbers in this publication are obtained through the IRS or directly from the foundations.

✓ **INSIDE TIP: DO NOT USE THE SHOTGUN APPROACH!**

We strongly discourage writing generic, impersonal letters that are sent to a large number of foundations. The successful grant search is a personalized process. Take the time to discuss your specific projects with foundation representatives before you request grants.

COMPLETENESS OF INFORMATION

In some cases, you may find that a given foundation's profile is incomplete. Although we provide foundations with the opportunity to review and correct data received from the IRS and to add data regarding their giving or geographic preferences, some foundations are unresponsive.

Also some data may seem dated. More often than not, this happens because a foundation has not filed a recent IRS 990-PF tax form. Another reason may be that the form has been filed late and processed in a later period. Keep these factors in mind while researching foundations.

AWARD LISTINGS

In this guide, you will find sample award listings in many of the foundation profiles. We also provide listings of the foundation's high, low, and median awards. Use these to determine whether your organization and its desired funding needs are consistent with a given foundation's history of giving.

FUNDING CATEGORIES

Our staff thoroughly researches foundation policies and patterns of giving. From this we have derived 12 general categories listed under the Interest category for each foundation.

“GIVES ONLY TO PRE-SELECTED ORGANIZATIONS”

This phrase is used frequently by smaller foundations, which often lack professional staff to respond to grant inquiries. In some cases, a foundation has been set up with a specific giving interest in mind.

✓ **INSIDE TIP: ACCESSING PRE-SELECTIVE FOUNDATIONS**

We do not recommend contacting foundations that pre-select grant recipients. However, if you are familiar with one of the foundation's officers or administrators, personal contact or a referral from a mutual contact could result in success.

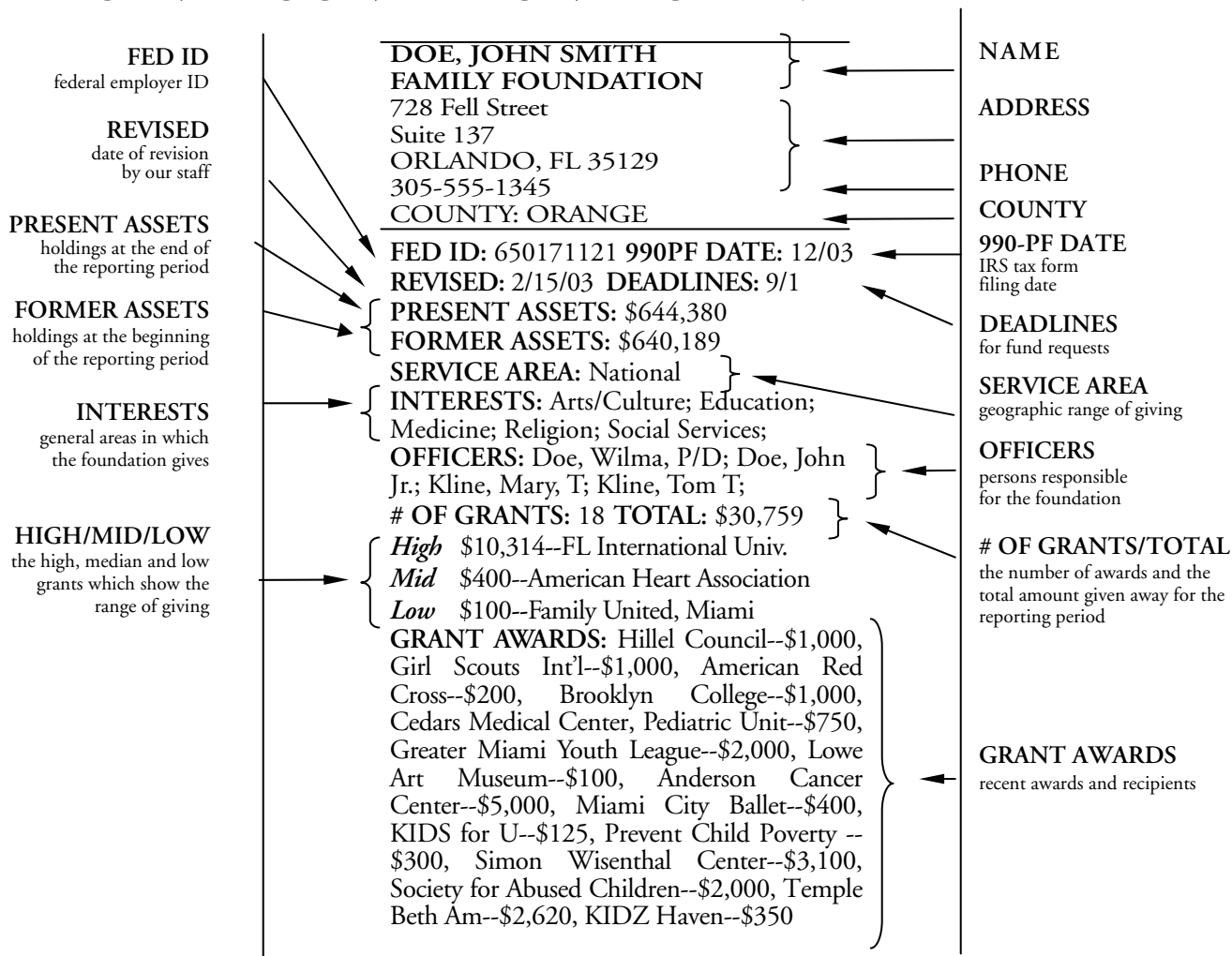
RELATIONSHIP TO OTHER PUBLICATIONS

Florida Funding Publications devotes its products to the needs of Florida grant-seekers, grant-makers, and associated professionals. If you are searching for a directory that includes foundations outside of Florida, we recommend contacting The Foundation Center in New York (www.fdncenter.org).

APPARENT DISCREPANCIES

Sometimes, an entry will show more money given in awards than a foundation reports in assets. This may occur when a corporation, for example, distributes nearly all of the funds placed into a foundation which it has established, while maintaining minimal carry-over or investment assets. This allows for tax advantages to be realized for a given year and a maximum accomplishment of public purpose.

WHAT'S IN A FOUNDATION PROFILE?



FOUNDATION PROFILE TERMS

Name

The name of the foundation is listed as it appears on its annual report or tax return. However, this name may be inverted for alphabetical purposes.

Address

The address is taken from the most recently filed IRS Form 990-PF or annual report.

Telephone

The telephone number is taken from the most recently filed IRS Form 990-PF for annual report. This number may be for the foundation's office, legal counsel, principal manager, or contact person.

County

This is the Florida County in which the foundation lists its main address.

Fed ID

The federal employer identification number is taken from the IRS Form 990-PF.

Period

This is the date of the end of the fiscal year for the most recent IRS Form 990-PF and not the date when the information was last updated.

Deadlines

These are dates set by the foundation for receiving applicant information for consideration.

Present Assets

These are total assets listed on the Form 990-PF or annual report at the end of the latest reporting period.

Former Assets

These are total assets listed on the Form 990-PF or annual report for the beginning of the reporting period.

Service Area

This is the geographic area (or areas) in which the foundation makes its awards. See below for geographic codes.

Officers

These are the names and titles as shown on the most recent IRS Form 990-PF. See below for officer codes.

Areas of Interest

These are giving priorities stated by the foundation or determined by the editor from the foundation's giving history, established for the most recent IRS form 990-PF. Categories and examples follow:

Arts & Culture:

Community Events, Community Service, Historic Preservation, Humanities, Media Communications, Dance, Libraries, Music, Museums, Radio Stations, Theater, Visual Arts.

Community:

Chamber of Commerce, Civil Air Patrol, Crime, Economic Development, Emergency Response, Equal Rights, General Benefit Programs, Law Enforcement, Public Facilities.

Education:

Adult Education, Higher Education, Junior Achievement, Primary Education, Parent Teacher Association, Preschool Education, Secondary Education, Medical Schools.

Environment:

Animal Rescue, Animal Rights, Beautification, Conservation, Ecology, Gardens, Arboretums, Humane Society, Parks, Zoos.

Health:

Hospice, Hospitals, Mental and Public Health.

Medicine:

AIDS Research, Health Associations, Medical Research, Medical School

Religion:

All Religious Organizations and Schools.

Research:

Scientific Institutes, Scientific Research.

Scholarship:

Financial aid for education, training, or individual students.

Social Services:

Drug Abuse Programs, Child Welfare, Disabled, Elderly, Family Planning, Homeless, YMCA, Red Cross, similar organizations.

Sports:

Camps, School Athletics, Special Olympics.

Other:

Highly specialized interests not included above.

Total

The total amount awarded during the period.

High/Mid/Low

The largest, median and smallest amount awarded by each foundation along with the recipients.

Comments

Contains additional information taken from the foundation's IRS Form 990-PF, survey response or is the observation of the research editor.

Grant Awards

A list of recent awards and recipients.

Geographic Codes

United States Postal Codes and directional abbreviations represent states and regions involving states.

EXAMPLE 1:

FL represents the State of Florida.
 NY represents the State of New York.
 US represents the United States.

EXAMPLE 2:

SE FL represents Southeastern Florida.
 SW FL represents Southwestern Florida.
 NE US represents the Northeastern United States.

The functions of each officer within the foundations are represented by the following abbreviations.

APPENDICES

APPENDIX A - COUNTY

An index of foundations by the county in which they are headquartered.

APPENDIX B - AREAS OF INTEREST

An index of foundations, grouped by area of interest. A foundation may be listed in more than one.

APPENDIX C - ASSET SIZE

The foundations are categorized by three asset sizes: 1) over \$1 million, 2) \$100,000 to \$1 million, 3) less than \$100,000 in assets. Foundations without present assets are not listed in this appendix.

APPENDIX D - TOTAL AMOUNT AWARDED

The foundations are categorized by the amount awarded during their last funding cycle under the following categories: 1) over \$100,000, 2) 100,000-\$25,000 3) less than \$25,000 in giving.

PLEASE NOTE: Our profiles represent the status of each foundation at the time its IRS 990-PF was filed. However, Florida's transient population makes it virtually impossible to keep up with the movements of smaller, private family foundations. As with previous editions, we have attempted to cross reference as much of the material as possible to bring you the most current information. We strongly recommend that you verify the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of each foundation and that you request application procedures before sending proposals or asking for grant funds.

A GRANTS PRIMER:

Preparing An Effective Grant Proposal

There are many different methods to preparing a private foundation grant request. The following six steps are recommended by John L. Adams & Company. Founded in 1976 as the first Florida grants consulting firm, John L. Adams & Company has successfully acquired hundreds of millions in dollars in grants for its clients.

STEP 1: NARROW THE SEARCH

Thorough preparation and research are critical for a successful grant proposal. As a first step, it is important to identify those funding sources which have the highest potential for meeting your funding needs. Facilitating the process is the main purpose of *The Complete Guide to Florida Foundations*. By comparing your funding needs to the priorities of grant givers, it will be possible to narrow your list down to a handful of potential grant sources. This step will limit the number of grant proposals that you need to prepare and will increase the chances of success for those which you have taken so much time to complete.

AREA

Begin by searching through Appendix A for foundations that are located in your county. Foundations often favor projects that are located in their area or in areas that are important to the founders or directors. It is especially helpful to identify those foundations which prefer giving in your city.

CORPORATE/COMMUNITY

After you have completed a list of foundations in your geographic area, it is a good idea to check and see whether there are any corporate or community foundations that might be appropriate sources of funding. Often community foundations and corporate foundations are the easiest to approach. They often publish application guidelines and annual reports, which enable the grant seeker to thoroughly research foundation priorities and giving patterns.

PROGRAM PRIORITIES

Appendix B will assist you in determining those foundations which share your own program priorities. This section lists foundations by the twelve areas of interest included in the foundation profiles. Keep in mind that, for many foundations, your program priorities may be more important than your geographical location. Many foundations that are interested in a particular category of funding are willing to distribute funds outside of their geographic areas.

ASSETS & GRANT AWARDS

Finally, you may wish to cross-reference your short list of potential sources with Appendix C and Appendix D to determine whether your best candidate can support your project. These appendices categorize the foundations by dollar assets and size of grant awards. If, for example, you have a \$1 million project, first approach larger foundations and ignore those smaller foundations which have assets less than \$200,000 and which make grant awards less than \$25,000.

Once you have a list of potential funding sources using the appendices, locate the corresponding foundation profiles in the main listings to gain further understanding of your potential funding sources.

STEP 2: KNOW YOUR FUNDING SOURCE

No matter how you identify a potential funding source, it is absolutely critical that you contact the person responsible for the administration of grant awards. Program priorities, requirements, and deadlines are constantly changing, so it is imperative that you make personal contact with the administrator in order to ensure that you have accurate information concerning the foundation's requirements. Program administrators can be very helpful during the grant writing process and can provide you with expertise in your area of interest. Do not underestimate the benefit of making personal contact.

STEP 3: KNOW YOUR ORGANIZATION AND ITS COMMUNITY

Once you have identified potential funding sources, request copies of the foundations' application forms and guidelines if they are available. Review these thoroughly. Many grant programs are quite specific in their funding requirements, and a small deviation could prevent your project from receiving funding. Don't hesitate to make changes in your proposal concept to ensure compliance with program requirements.

Begin preparation of your proposal by collecting all data possible in relation to your project. You will need a budget, a narrative concerning the project, a timetable and supporting documentation, including articles of incorporation, bylaws, and tax exempt certification.

Photographs can often increase the effectiveness of a proposal. Relevant statistics related to your project can also help. For example, if you are funding an environmental education program, it is important to know which other programs exist in your area, how many individuals would be served by your program, and what kind of impact your program might have on endangered species or key environmental concerns in your area. All of this information can be used in the proposal narrative to make it more effective.

STEP 4: INCLUDE BASIC ELEMENTS IN THE PROPOSAL

While some foundations and giving programs require different proposal formats, many will include the basic proposal elements listed below:

LETTER OF TRANSMITTAL

A cover letter should always accompany your proposal. It should indicate that the proposal has been prepared to comply with the guidelines of the foundation's funding program. The letter should give a brief overview of the project and specify the amount of funding being requested.

PROJECT SUMMARY

This is an outline of your proposal. It should include such essential information as the name of the program, address, contact person, purpose of the program, program benefits, need for the program, cost, methods which will be used to evaluate the program, qualifications of the agency to administer the program, and a brief explanation regarding how funding for the program will be achieved.

BODY

This is the narrative portion of your proposal. It should follow the basic structure of the project summary but should elaborate on each of the points. Effort should be made to make this portion of the proposal interesting without making it too lengthy. This is where the argument is made for why this project should be funded. Use every means possible to prove that your project will be the best use of this agency's funds. Very often there is a prescribed list of questions in the program guidelines, which must be answered in this section.

BUDGET

The budget is the core of the proposal. This should be prepared first, and the rest of the proposal should support it. It should include the estimated costs, as well as the formulas used to determine the costs. Use caution in preparing your budget. Once again, refer to the program guidelines. There are very specific restrictions on the use of grant funding. Make sure that your budget does not violate these rules. It is often a good idea to include a column indicating what portions of the project will be funded by your organization or other funding sources.

LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

While letters of recommendation are not always required, it never hurts to include them. Care should be taken to obtain written support for your project from a variety of knowledgeable individuals. It is a good idea to have letters from government officials, specialists in the field and private citizens.

SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION

Included in this section are documents such as articles of incorporation, by-laws, tax exempt certificates, photographs or other required documentation. Be sure to review the application guidelines carefully. It will often provide a list of documentation that is needed. Make an effort to fill every request. Often an application will become ineligible if this information is incomplete.

From start to finish, a proposal should be an obvious argument for your project. It does not pay to be subtle. You need to get your point across to a reviewer who is not familiar with your project and also may not be familiar with your organization. Strive to make your proposal clear and simple. However, it may also be necessary to repeat key points in the proposal several times using different formats.

THE COVER

Once you have taken the time to prepare all of the components, take the time to make the presentation attractive. Remember, the individuals reviewing the proposal may be reviewing hundreds at a time. Make the proposal as easy to read as possible.

STEP 5: REVIEW THE PROPOSAL

After you have completed the proposal, it is often a good idea to have several people review it before it is submitted. A neutral person is more effective, because he or she is unfamiliar with the proposal and is more likely to notice portions which may be unclear or incomplete. If possible, try to locate a person at the foundation to which you are submitting the proposal who is willing to review it. Staff is often willing to do this if you provide them with a copy well in advance of the deadline date. This can provide you with valuable input.

STEP 6: MEET THE DEADLINE!

Once you have completed all of the above steps, make sure that the proposal is received by the agency before the deadline. An application is often ineligible if it is received after the deadline. Not all foundations have deadlines for applications, but those that do are often very strict about this. Prepare and send your proposal with plenty of time to spare, then call to verify that it has been received.

These guidelines for proposal preparation are meant to serve as an example. They are based on methods, which have been used successfully by our company; however, they are not meant to represent the only method for preparing a proposal. It is essential that the grant writer consult the guidelines provided by the foundation to ensure that the proposal meets all requirements for the program.

Facts About Form 990-PF & Recent Laws for Charities: What You Should Know

Private foundations are required to file a Form 990-PF. The 990-PF is simply a private foundation's annual tax return. If you think you know everything about the 990-PF, read on. Recent laws have been written that affect private foundations and disclosure of their tax returns. This article is an overview of Form 990-PF filing requirements, information required by the Form and other related information. Keep in mind that this article serves as a guide and simply highlights information that you should know.

Everyone who deals with private foundations, whether grant-giver or grant-seeker, should have a basic understanding of the 990-PF. It provides a wealth of information for grant makers, the public, investigative reporters, or anyone who has a reason to acquire information about a particular private foundation. Because it is available to the public (in addition to the fact that it is a tax return signed under penalty of perjury), each private foundation should make every effort to provide accurate and complete information. The 990-PF can serve as a marketing tool as well as a verification tool.

As a general matter, anyone interested in a 990-PF can educate himself by simply reviewing the IRS instructions to the return. The instructions explain each entry and provide references to governing Internal Revenue Code (IRC) provisions. In addition to the 990-PF Instructions, IRS Publication 578 (Tax Information for Private Foundations and Foundation Managers) provides a great deal of information. The 990-PF Instructions and Publication 578 probably provide more information than most people want. Anyone serious about the area should, at a minimum, be familiar with both.

WHAT IS A PRIVATE FOUNDATION?

Each organization that is exempt under Section 501(c)(3) (all section references are to sections of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 as amended) is either a private foundation or a public charity. Literally the Internal Revenue Code provides that all 501(c)(3) organizations are private foundations unless they are described in Section 509(a)(1)-(4). The Internal Revenue Code does not refer to public charities. A public charity is generally a charitable organization that 1) is described in Section 170(b)(1)(A) such as schools, hospitals, etc; 2) receives more than 1/3 of its support from the general public and less than 1/3 of its support from investments; 3) supports a public charity; or 4) is organized for testing for public safety. A person can quickly determine whether an organization is exempt and whether it is a private foundation from IRS Publication 78. Most public charities file a Form 990 and private foundations file a Form 990-PF. There are other forms, but these are the two basic forms.

FORM 990-PF FILING REQUIREMENTS

A private foundation is required to file a Form 990-PF annually by the 15th day of the 5th month following the close of its accounting period. For example, a calendar year foundation is required to file its 990-PF by May 15th. There is no minimum gross receipts standard for filing as with a public charity. Thus, all private foundations must file a 990-PF. The foundation would file its return in the IRS Key District in which it is located. Florida foundations would therefore file in Atlanta, Georgia.

Keep in mind that there is a penalty for not filing. Penalties may include:

- \$10 per day for each day the return is late
- \$5,000 or 5% of gross receipts maximum fine
- ½ of 1% (up to 25%) of any unpaid excise tax.

Although these penalties can be waived, the IRS is doing it less and less.

WHERE ELSE DO YOU HAVE TO FILE?

A private foundation is required to file a copy of the 990-PF with the state's Attorney General.

PUBLIC INSPECTION

A principle reason to make sure the 990-PF is accurate is that it must be made available to the public. It may be obtained by the public from the IRS on Form 4506-A or by writing:

REQUIRED PUBLIC NOTICE

To insure the public is aware of 990-PF's, each private foundation is required to publish a notice of availability in a newspaper of general circulation in the county in which the foundation's principle office is located. The notice must state that the 990-PF is available and must give the address and telephone number of the private foundation as well as its principle manager.

RECENT LAWS YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT

President Clinton signed the Taxpayer Bill of Rights 2 (TBR 2) on July 30, 1996. TBR 2 contains one of the most important changes to the laws governing public charities since the 1969 Tax Reform Act. That is the so-called intermediate sanctions.

After several years of urging by the IRS and practitioners, Congress passed a version of intermediate sanctions which provide for an excise tax in lieu of revocation of exempt status where the IRS, in effect, finds private inurement but, in its judgment, concludes that the private inurement is not sufficiently bad to cause revocation of exempt status. The IRS will still be able to revoke exempt status where it determines that the private inurement violation is so egregious as to call into question the exempt organization's characterization as a charity.

EXCISE TAX

The new law imposes an excise tax on excess benefit transactions between disqualified persons and exempt organizations. A disqualified person is, with respect to any transaction, a person who, at the date of the transaction or during the five preceding years, was in a position to "exercise substantial influence" over the affairs of the exempt organization. The excise tax is 25% of the "excess" and is imposed on the disqualified person, not the exempt organization (both Section 501(c)(3) and 501(c)(4). A foundation manager (officer, director, trustee, or similarly situated person) is subject to a 10% excise tax if the foundation manager knowingly participates in an excess benefit transaction. Other requirements apply in this law. Consult with your legal counsel regarding these requirements.

EXCESS BENEFIT TRANSACTION

There are two types of excess benefit transactions. First, and the most often cited example, is compensation. If compensation received by a "disqualified" person is unreasonable (that is, it exceeds fair market value for the services rendered) then that disqualified person is subject to a 25% excise tax (increasing to 200% if the transaction is not corrected) on the excess of the compensation received over reasonable compensation.

The second type of excess benefit transaction is a transaction in which the benefit provided the disqualified person is based in whole or in part on the revenue of the exempt organization providing the benefit and such transaction is deemed to involve private inurement under current law.

VOLUNTEER BOARD MEMBERS EXCEPTED FROM PENALTY

This is the so-called Responsible Person Penalty. The IRC provides that a person responsible for the operations of an organization may have individual liability for withheld payroll taxes (FICA and income tax) that the organization does not pay to the IRS. TBR 2 provides that a volunteer board member not active in the day-to-day operations of the organization will not be considered a Responsible Person.

PUBLIC INSPECTION OF TAX RETURNS

Current law requires Section 501(c)(3) organizations to make their tax returns (Form 990-PF) available for public inspection. TBR 2 liberalizes that rule and requires the exempt organization to provide a copy of the return if requested in person or in writing.

IMPORTANT NOTE

These are just a few of the highlights of TBR 2. Other provisions in the law apply but are not included in this article. Because many of the rules regarding these laws were not written at the time of print, we are unable to provide specific details about future changes. It is best, however, to err on the side of caution until these laws are further interpreted. In the meantime, contact your legal counsel for more information about TBR 2.

GRANTSEEKERS GLOSSARY

A

Accountability

Accountability refers to the responsibility associated with receiving grant funds. An organization which receives a grant award assumes accountability by ensuring that the gift is utilized and expended as promised and that this fact is made available to the public.

Advisory Board

This is a group of individuals who lend their advice and credibility to an organization.

Articles of Incorporation

This document establishes the recipient organization's legal status. In many cases, the foundations found in this guide require a copy of the Articles of Incorporation before considering an organization's project beyond the initial inquiry stage.

Asset

An asset is anything the organization owns or possesses that has value, such as cash, real estate, or securities.

Audit

An audit is a detailed examination of the organization's financial records, affairs, investments, and documents.

B

Benefactor

This term refers to a donor, usually a generous one.

By-Laws

These are the rules established by an organization's board of directors. By-laws are usually an addendum to the organization's Articles of Incorporation.

C

Charitable Organization

This refers to an organization that is both nonprofit and tax-exempt as described in 501(c)(3) and 170(b)(1)(A) of the IRC. This type of organization generally does not refer to a private foundation.

D

Development

This is the act or process of taking actions associated with expanding an organization's goals or mission.

Donor

A donor is an organization or individual who gives grants or awards.

E

Endowment

This is a fund in which certain restrictions protect the initial principal and allow income to be spent as per the instructions of the board of directors—usually for operating costs.

F

Family Foundation

This term refers to a smaller, private foundation staffed with the original donor's family members.

501(c)(3)

This refers to the section of the Internal Revenue Code that addresses nonprofit charitable, tax-exempt organizations.

Foundation

A foundation is a type of trust which is required by law (in exchange for its tax-exempt status) to disburse a minimum of 5% of its assets per year to not-for-profit organizations.

G

Grant

A grant is a financial award, donation, or contribution given to support an organization, individual, project, or program.

Grantsmanship

This is the process of obtaining grants via written proposals.

I

IRC—Internal Revenue (Service) Code

These are the federal laws that address taxation.

IRS—Internal Revenue Service

This is the federal agency responsible for policies and enforcement of taxation.

L

Letter of Intent

This document provides written correspondence specifying a donor's intention to award a grant or to make a gift.

Leverage

As in "leveraging funds," this term refers to the use of funds effectively to attract additional funds.

M

Matching Funds

These are monies contributed with the condition that another donor will give an agreed-upon amount of money within a specified time limit.

N

Not-For-Profit

This is an organization that is qualified by the IRS under 501(c)(3) laws that operates without financial incentive.

P

Public Charity

A public charity is usually a foundation that receives one third of its income from donations.

THE FOUNDATION CENTER COOPERATING COLLECTIONS

The Foundation Center, headquartered in New York, is an independent service organization that was established by foundations to provide information on philanthropic giving.
